









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Provides a system-wide response framework, while also allowing for individualized interventions







Purpose: To restore the learning environment after it has been disrupted by a natural or man-made disaster.

ED has awarded SERV grants following:

- 9/11
- Hurricane Katrina
- Newtown
- Joplin, MO tornado
- Pine Ridge Reservation
- Aurora, CO
- Hurricane Sandy



Typical Grant: Brunswick, Ohio School District

One High School: Between December 2011 and January 2014

8 student deaths at the high school:

- suicides
- car accidents
- illnesses

SERV: Paid for 1 full-time social worker:

- to provide mental health counseling and support
 - to students, staff, parents and other affected community members
- 



Allowable Services and Activities under Project SERV

Mental health assessments, referrals and services

Overtime for staff

Substitute teachers for staff too traumatized to teach

Transportation and other costs to operate school at an alternative site



Unallowable Services and Activities under Project SERV

- Other resources are available, e.g., insurance
- Payments of fines / settlements / legal fees
- Costs for hospitalization/ medical treatment

Typical Project SERV Grants

Two-tiers/types of grants

Immediate Services:

- \$50,000
- 6 months

Extended Services:

- \$250,000
- 18 months

- ED Outreach – No Notice Inviting Applications
 - Collaborative Development of Application



- The HUD Consolidated Plan is required for:
 - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
 - Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)
 - HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds.
- The EDA CEDS is required for:
 - Public Works Program
 - Economic Adjustment Program.
- Cook County Planning for Progress Initiative:
 - Over 15 months, the County and CMAP engaged more than 2,000 stakeholders
 - Will coordinate over \$280 million in estimated federal funds between 2015 and 2019
 - Five areas to strategically invest resources:

• Infrastructure and Public Facilities	• Non-Housing Services
• Housing Development and Services	• Planning and Administration
• Business and Workforce Development	


